Hinton T. Shackelford, 91, of Zolfo Springs, passed away in Sebring on Wednesday, September 19, 2018. He was born in Wauchula on July 25, 1927. "Shack" was a lifelong resident of Hardee County.

He served in the United States Army in Korea, formerly worked at Pioneer Park for 14 years as assistant manager, and was a member of New Hope Baptist Church.
